

CAPT. CRAIG MALLOY

DIRECTOR, NAVAL HOSPITAL JACKSONVILLE AND COMMANDER,

NAVY MEDICINE READINESS & TRAINING COMMAND JACKSONVILLE



A native of New South Wales, Australia, Capt. Craig T. Malloy received his Diploma of Applied Science in Nursing from Mitchell College of Advanced Education in 1989. He immigrated to the United States in 1990 and was employed as a civilian nurse. In 1995, Malloy enlisted in the Naval Reserves. In 2000, he completed his Bachelors of Science in Nursing from Barry University in Miami Shores, Florida, and he obtained his citizenship and a commission in the U.S. Naval Reserves.

In August 2001, Malloy commenced into active duty service at National Naval Medical Center Bethesda, Maryland. In July 2004, he was assigned to U.S. Naval Hospital (NH) Guam. Next, Malloy completed a temporary duty assignment at Naval Trauma Training Course at L.A. County Hospital, Los Angeles, California.

In August 2007, Malloy was assigned to Fleet Surgical Team (FST) Six, Little Creek, Virginia, where he completed deployments on the USS Bataan (LHD-5) and covert missions on the USS Mesa Verde (LPD-19). Following the FST assignment, Malloy was assigned to Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, Virginia, August 2009. There, he was selected as division officer representing six surgical disciplines.

In 2011, Malloy deployed to Tarin Kowt, Afghanistan, as the perioperative nurse and senior nursing officer of the Role 2E Hospital. Upon returning to Portsmouth, he transitioned into the clinical coordinator position and then assistant department head. In December 2014, Malloy transferred to NH Lemoore, California, serving as Perioperative Services department head and then was selected as director of Medical Services and head of Quality Management. In July 2017, Malloy took over as Nurse Corps assignment officer for approximately 900 constituents at the Bureau of Personnel in Millington, Tennessee. In December 2019, he assumed the role of associate director of Nursing Services Navy Medicine Readiness & Training Command (NMRTC) Portsmouth. In June 2022, Malloy assumed the role of executive officer at NMRTC Rota, Spain.

In June 2024, Malloy assumed the role of director of NH Jacksonville (and its five branch health clinics) and commander of NMRTC Jacksonville (and its five units).

Malloy is designated as a Surface Warfare Medical Department Officer. Personal awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (four awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (six awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (two awards), and multiple tour and campaign awards.
